

# **Dress Code Policy**

## 1. Safety First

Since students will be working with tools, equipment, and materials, the following safety guidelines apply:

# Closed-Toe Shoes Are Mandatory

o Sandals, flip-flops, or any open-toed footwear are not allowed. Students will not be able to participate in courses without closed footwear.

## Secure Clothing

- o Avoid loose or baggy clothing that could get caught in machinery.
- Long sleeves should be fitted or rolled up when working near moving parts.

#### Hair and Accessories

- Long hair must be tied back to prevent it from getting tangled in equipment.
- Scarves will not be allowed near machinery.
- o Remove dangling jewellery such as long necklaces, bracelets, or earrings.

## 2. Appropriate Attire

Students should wear clothing that is comfortable, practical, and suitable for a shared, hands-on learning environment:

#### Tops and Bottoms

- Shirts must fully cover the torso.
- Shorts, skirts, or pants must be of an appropriate length or the student will need to wear a work apron.
- o Clothing with offensive language, images, or graphics is prohibited.



## 3. Personal Protective Equipment

For certain projects or activities, additional protective equipment may be required:

- Safety Glasses will be provided and must be worn when working with tools or chemicals.
- Gloves may be required for handling specific materials or equipment.
- Aprons or Lab Coats are available to protect clothing during messy projects.

### 4. Inclusivity and Expression

Cresconova encourages creativity and self-expression, as long as it aligns with safety and respect for others:

- Students may express their individuality through clothing, provided it complies with the guidelines above.
- We are committed to fostering an inclusive environment, so clothing or symbols that promote hate, discrimination, or exclusion are strictly prohibited

# 5. Consequences for Dress Code Violations

If a student's attire does not meet the dress code:

- 1. **First Instance**: A verbal reminder will be given, and the student may need to adjust their attire (e.g., tie back hair, wear safety gear).
- 2. **Repeated Violations**: Parents/guardians will be contacted, and the student may be temporarily restricted from participating in certain activities.
